Boat Trip on the Capt. Morgan (Please note: registration is required)

Saturday, September 25, 2010, 11.00 a.m.



The tour starts and ends at the quay near the Berliner Dom. Experience the fascinating multitude of historical sites of the Berlin city center from a completely new perspective. This trip on the river Spree will take you along some of the world-famous sights of Berlin such as the Reichstag in the governmental district, Berliner Dom, Pergamon- or Bodemuseum on Museum Island or the new building of the central train station Lehrter Bahnhof.

Berlin is indeed rich in important cultural symbols and historical settings. This tour is designed to give a short but thorough introduction to the city's ever-evolving landscape.

Some of the highlights along the route:

Nikolaiviertel – Historical quarter also known as the Cradle of Berlin.

Mühlendamm Schleuse – one of the two sluices that make the city center navigable for ships and boats

Berliner Dom- the famous cathedral of Berlin

Museumsinsel – on Museum Island many renowned museums are located

Bahnhof Friedrichstraße – train station divided by the Iron Curtain during the Cold War

Reichstag – German parliament in the governmental district

Lehrter Bahnhof – new building of the central train station

Schloß Bellevue – Seat of the Federal President of Germany

East Side Gallery – so called “Foreland Wall” painted by an artist group after the fall of the wall

Duration: Approximately 2 hours
Route: The tour starts from the quay at the Berliner Dom / Hotel Radisson Blue (nearest train station is "Hackescher Markt")
Time: Saturday, September 25, 2010, 11.00 a.m. – 1.00 p.m.

If you have not registered in advance, please come to our conference registration desk (at Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin or at Paul-Löbe-Haus) to check if there are still seats available (price: 20 €).

The quay where the boat trip starts is located directly in front of the "DDR museum", near Radisson Blue Hotel.
